Solutions for Social Inclusion

Universal Access

- Set small achievable goals based in the core competencies of Social Awareness and Responsibility https://bit.ly/2FBc4Xn
- Plan for DL to be inclusive learning for all https://bit.ly/301RwhF
- Use visuals to establish new routines, e.g. handwashing
- Use photo name tags when wearing masks
- Build tolerance of school sites with short social visits
- Help all students to understand different ways of being present with same age peers: outdoors
 activities can bring classmates together as they share a bike ride or play backyard games such as
 bocce
- Use a variety of no-tech and high-tech visuals to support all learners

Foundational Skills for Team

- Respect family's decisions regarding health at this time
- Talk to families about the local protocols for school's use of Zoom or other platform
- Invite family members to visit schools and understand the protocols
- Establish check-in times with families to provide information on classroom themes and lessons
- Offer choices of which classes to attend for students accessing schools
- The increase in use technology for everyone means our students who rely on technology to participate are more easily included
- Increase 'wait' time for students on zoom to respond
- Spend time preparing students to be back in school with clear goals and structured steps to achieve goals
